Northwest Addition Bustling with Activity

You may not notice at first glance, but more than 170 workers continue pushing forward on Monroe Clinic's new hospital building. Over the next four to six months, workers for the project will be at its peak. The lower level is about 90 percent complete, and the other levels are not too far behind. Much of the activity continues inside and includes:

- Finishing drywall and painting
- Installing casework and doors
- Completing ceiling grid work
- Pulling cable for data and networking needs

Sending a Signal

Key communication tools may soon be visible atop the new building. The "antenna farm" as it's called, is beginning to rise up. Antennae will appear over the next few weeks and provide a link to key partners like local police departments, fire departments and Green County EMS. Others will provide reception for cell phones, satellite phones and internal radios.

Paving the Way for Green Roofs

In a few months, the new green roofs should be in place. The paver systems and grids are being laid out so once the plants arrive, they're ready for installation. In all, the new hospital has three green roofs. All provide a great view and aid in Monroe Clinic's efficiency and healing environment. One—the chapel garden—is accessible for patients.

Making the Grade

Since the majority of exterior work is nearing completion, much of the prep work will soon begin for the finishing touches on the grounds. Final grading will take place in many areas over the next couple months. Once it's complete, blacktop, curbs, sidewalks and landscaping can begin. Look for these developments to begin very soon!
