Emergency Department

Open 24/7

- Severe chest pain
- Difficulty breathing
- Compound fractures (bone protrudes through skin)
- Convulsions, seizures, loss of consciousness
- Fever in baby less than 3 months old
- Heavy bleeding
- Deep knife or gunshot wounds
- Moderate to severe burns
- Poisoning
- Serious head, neck or back injury
- Pregnancy-related problems that occur after normal clinic hours
- Signs of Stroke (i.e. loss of vision, sudden numbness, weakness, slurred speech/confusion)
- Suicidal or homicidal feelings

Call 911 or go directly to the Emergency Department
